- * Compostable Cups, Lids & Utensils
PLA, "biodegradable"
- * Wooden Products
Coffee stir sticks, chopsticks
- * Teabags



NO!

- * Non-Compostable Coffee Lids
- * Liquids or Ice
- * Plastic
- * Glass
- * Metal
- * Styrofoam
- * Soymilk or Juice Boxes

RECYCLE: PAPER



YES!

- * **CLEAN, DRY** Paper
 - * **CLEAN** Cardboard
 - * Magazines, Books, & Newspapers
 - * Colored Paper
 - * Post-it Notes
 - * Junk Mail
- (Staples and plastic-windowed envelopes are okay!)

NO!

- * **BOTTLES** and **CANS**
- * Food-Soiled or Wet Paper
- * Soymilk and Juice Boxes
- * Waxed Paper
- * Plastic Laminated Paper
- * Paper with Stickers
- * Paper Towels, Napkins, Cups, and Plates



RECYCLE:



BEVERAGE CONTAINERS



NO!

- * PAPER
- * Plastics #3-7
- * Plastic/Paper Cups
- * Soymilk or Juice Boxes
- * Yogurt Containers

YES!



- * Plastics #1 and #2
(Narrow-necked bottles only)
- * Glass Bottles
- * Aluminum Cans
- * Metal Cans

LANDFILL

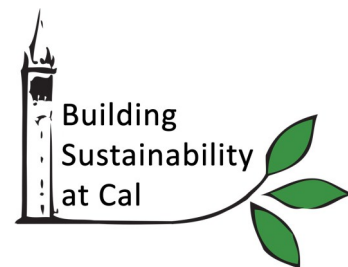


YES!

- * Plastics #3-7, Unlabeled Plastic Packaging, Straws, etc.
- * Wide Mouth Plastic
- * #1 Plastic Lids (flat, dome)
- * Styrofoam
- * Soymilk and Juice Boxes
- * Non-Compostable Coffee Lids and Utensils

NO!

- * Food Waste
- * Clean Paper
- * #1 and #2 Plastic Bottles
- * Anything else that can be **COMPOSTED** or **RECYCLED**. Please check the other signs.
