

Electronic Data Exchange (EDI) Claims Submission:

If a provider or provider office submits less than 1500 claims per month to Blue Shield, using an approved Electronic Data Interchange (EDI) clearinghouse is probably best for the provider/provider office.

Blue Shield’s approved EDI clearinghouses typically offer a variety of services that can help reduce administrative costs by increasing office efficiency. An internet connection is required to submit claims electronically.

Steps to enroll with a clearinghouse

To exchange electronic transmissions with Blue Shield using an EDI clearinghouse, follow these simple instructions:

Step 1: Choose a Blue Shield approved EDI clearinghouse from the list below.

Step 2: Contact the selected EDI clearinghouse to enroll and begin testing. If you are already enrolled with one of these clearinghouses, please contact the clearinghouse directly for the Blue Shield Payer ID for claims submission.

Step 3: After testing with the clearinghouse is completed, the exchange of electronic transactions can begin.
